



Dual Enrollment Snapshot



Students participating in this program will have to complete a Community College application for enrollment at the start of the Fall and Spring semester. Participating in this program will ease the transition from high school to college and encourage them to keep pursuing postsecondary education. Upon completion of the course, the students receive a community college transcript with the grade and units of the Dual Enrollment course.

Dual Enrollment benefits to students:

- No student fees for the course and the eventual credits (if CA resident).
- Student does not need to leave the high school campus or go off-site to take the Dual Enrollment class.
- Immediate transferable credit/grade is awarded at the end of the course.
- Most courses are transferable to CSU and UC.
- Students build college credits since high school.

High School's Responsibilities:

- Print out Transcripts for all students of the Dual Enrollment classes. Transcripts need to be delivered to Dual Enrollment teacher on campus.
- Counselor and Principal Signatures on Applications.

Enrollment Process:

- Students Enroll in the Valley ROP Class.
- Complete the SCCC application for Admission.
- No More than 5 unexcused absences in prior semester.
- 2.5 Cumulative GPA.
- "C" or better in prior semester of year long Valley ROP Course.
- Student has no major discipline and behavioral issues in and out of the class.
- No suspensions during the current school year.
- Teacher Approval and Recommendation if GPA is below 2.5 or any of the above requirements are not met.
